When the financial condition of the family completely broke in 2008 they decided to take Lalitha to Govt Camp in their village. The Dr. in the camp read the report and searched the address of TSCS on net and directed them to go to the society.

Lalitha is much better in her health then before. She studies in class 10th and wants to become a doctor. Great strength and positive outlook is required to face the challenges and meet the expenses for a chronic illness like this. .

As a patient, or parent of a patient with such a disorder you are frequently put in the position of advocating for yourself or your child. Building a good relation with TSCS care givers & healthcare providers, gave Lalitha a new lease of life. Important decisions made easy, with free access to TSCS.

Building relationships with TSCS and other families with similar situation , can provides an important support network for patients who are trying to give heir best.

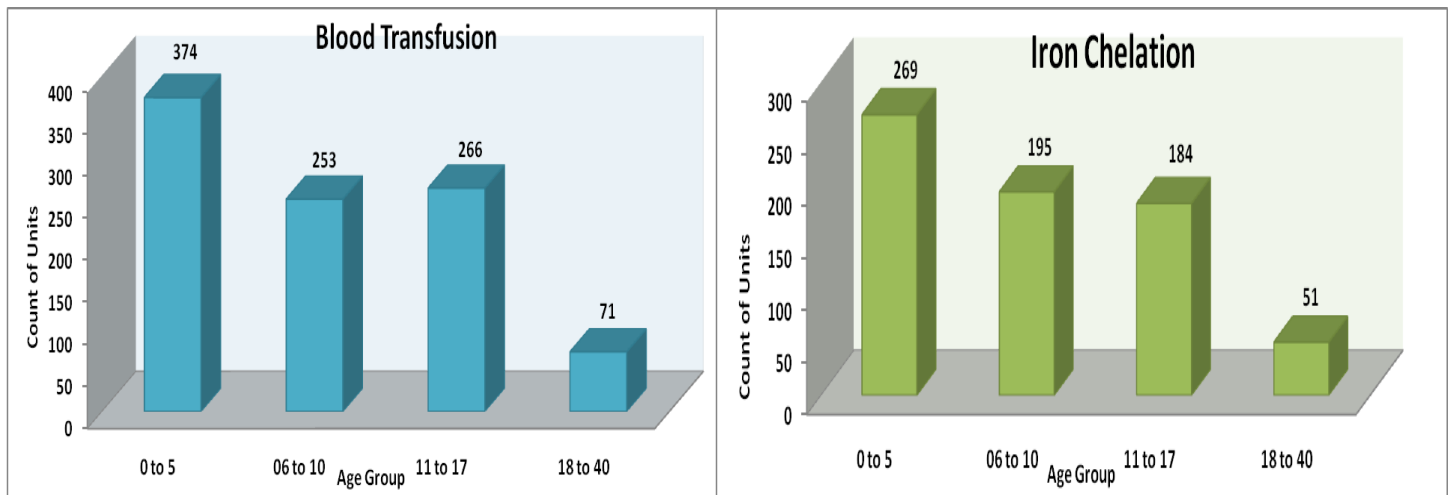
Maintaining treatment routine is at the top priority. It can be challenging at times, but it 's worth it.

When Lalitha was born in 2007, her parents were told that the life expectancy for a person born with thalassemia is short

The process of transfusion continued for Lalitha for a period of 2 years, every time the child would be admitted for 7 days in the Hospital, amounting to Rupees 7 to 8 thousand each time. Parents were ignorant of what is happening to the child, . Coming from a non educated background and working as a helper in a shop, earning 5 thousand per month made Anjinalu (Lalitha 's Father) started thinking of other alternate.



Transfusion Details

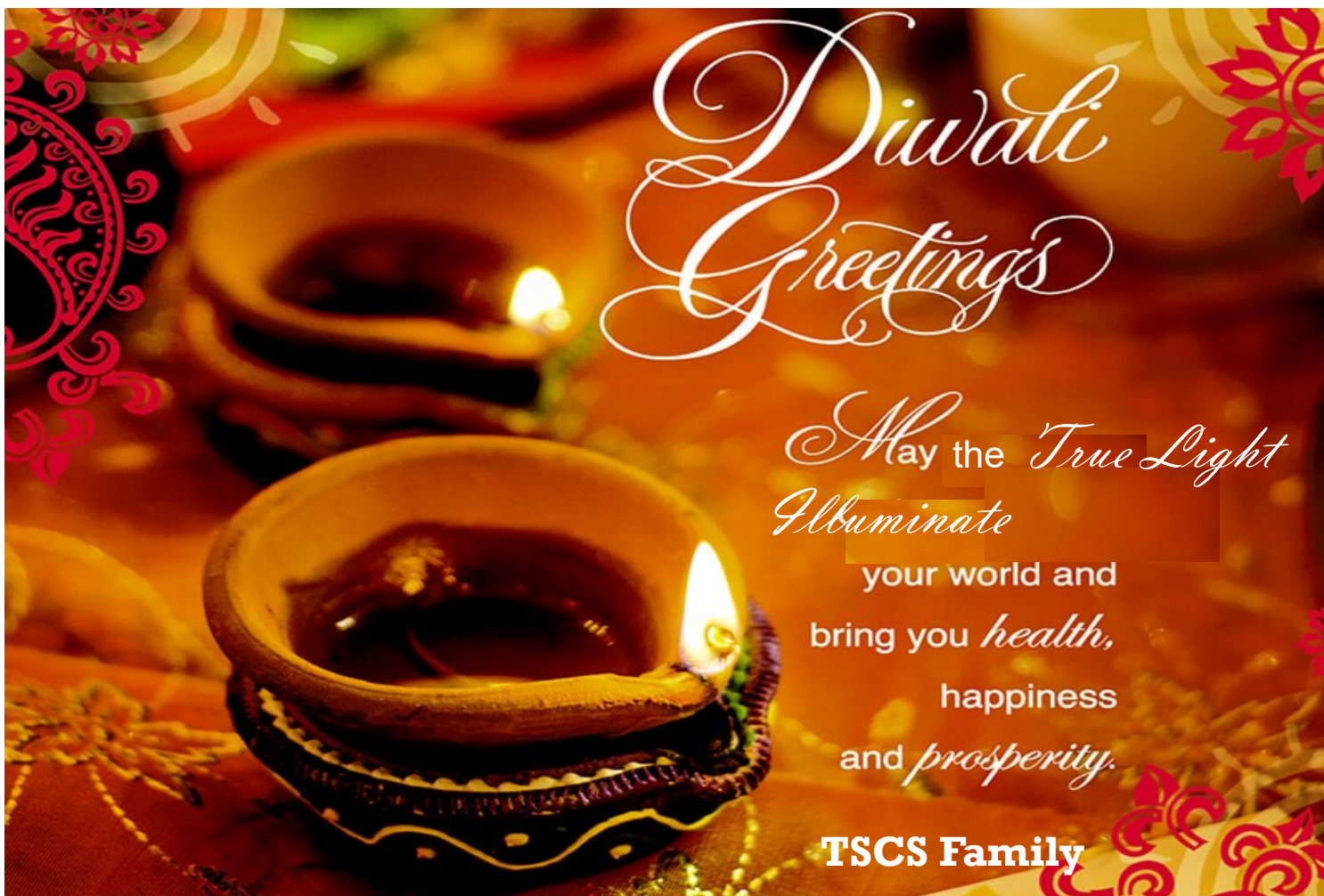


Total number of patients for the month of **September 2019** including all patients group were **964** some patients were given 2 units of blood, the total units provided where **1216**
