Pavani is a 22year old thalassemia patient born to Venkata Subbaiah and kalavathi residing in Rajampeta mandal, Anmaya district. Father was an electrician and mother a homemaker, earning hardly enough to meet their monthly requirements. Pavani is their only child and they were shocked to learn that their child was affected with thalassemia at the age of 5 months when she started looking pale and was frequently falling ill. Her parents took her to a hospital in Chennai. All the investigations were done and she was diagnosed with thalassemia. She was put on blood transfusions and continued to take treatment there for six years. Then, they continued their treatment in a government hospital in Hyderabad. They came to know about Thalassemia and sickle cell society and got registered with the society at an age of 15years.




Pavani's life took a turn when her grandmother who was very supportive to her expired all of a sudden. Her father also expired within a span of one month due to liver damage. She also had to discontinue her studies due to financial problems. She couldn't bear this trauma and went to depression until she met Mohasina Tabassum, another thalassemia patient during her visit to Cuddapah RIMS where she took blood transfusions. They soon became



good friends and Tabassum inspired her to see the bright side of future. They are now guiding and motivating other patients and parents to take regular blood transfusions and follow the treatment properly. They are creating awareness about thalassemia and the need for getting tested for the blood disorder. These two friends are a true inspiration for other patients who consider the disorder as a curse and blame GOD for having given them this pain.

TSCS team Visited Balanagar PHC on 2nd Aug 2022 and issued HPLC (HbA2 test) reports to all the family members (38) of four families enrolled in cascade screening Project. Carrier Adolescents were counselled for premarital screening and carrier couples were suggested prenatal diagnosis at every pregnancy.

PROTECTION AGAINST MALARIA

Malaria is one of the most prevalent problems during the monsoon season. It is caused by a parasite called plasmodium parasite which is spread to humans through the bites of infected mosquitoes. Old or young, anyone can become susceptible to this disease, especially those who live in areas that have high potential for mosquito breeding.

Signs and symptoms include fever and sweating, chills that shake one's whole body,

headache, muscle, chest pain, breathing problem, cough, diarrhoea etc.











So, how to protect oneself from this disease:

- 1. Apply mosquito repellent with DEET (diethyltoluamide) to exposed skin.
- 2. Drape mosquito netting over beds.
- 3. Close doors and windows.
- 4. Wear long pants and long sleeves to cover the skin.
- 5. Remove the stagnant water.
