In the end, Thalassemia has never intervened in my academic and personal life, hence my journey with thalassemia has not only shaped my life but also educated hundreds of people around me.

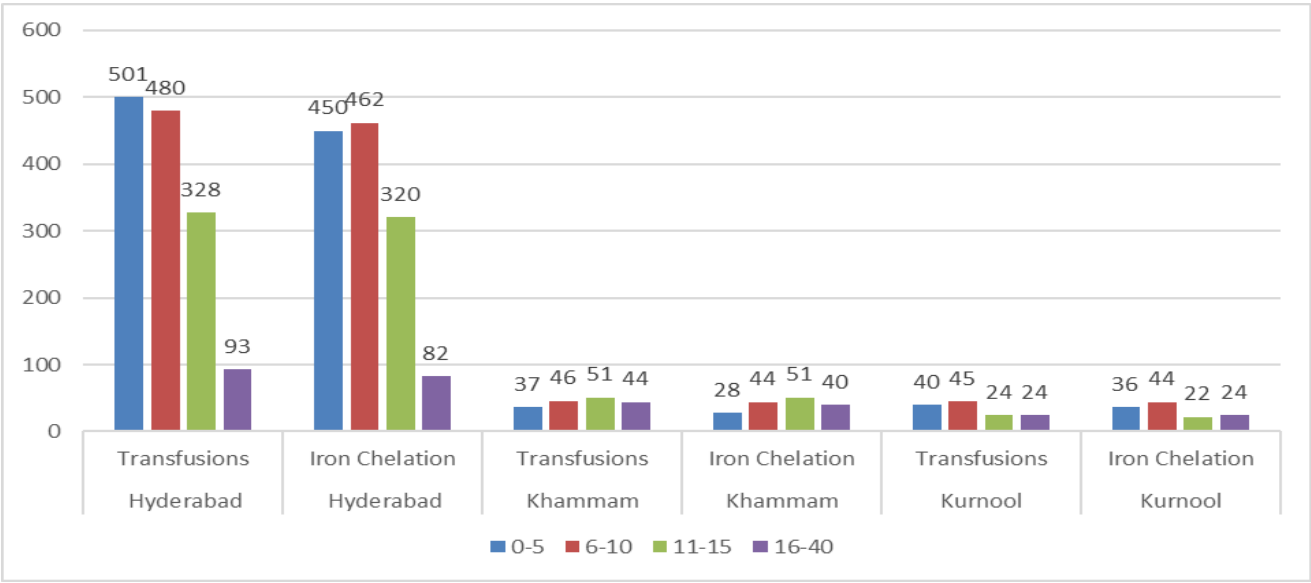
Let's join hands to bring awareness in the society to prevent Thalassemia births by simple HbA2 test to know that carrier status.

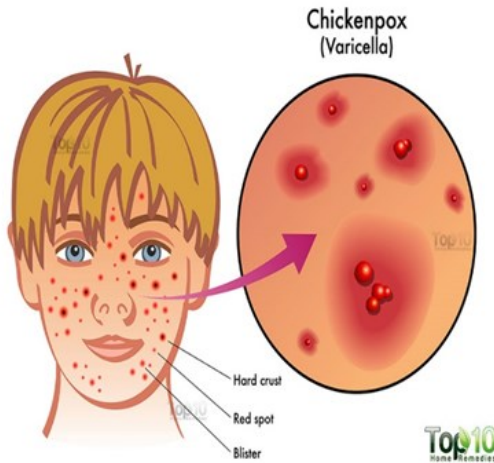

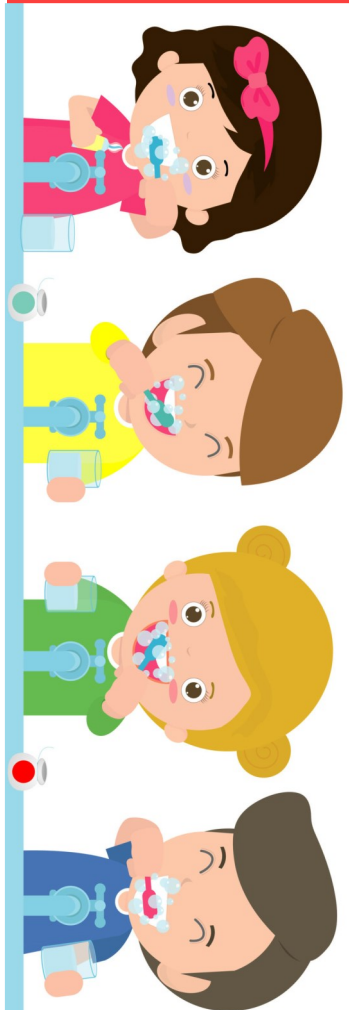
CHICKENPOX

Chickenpox is a contagious viral infection mainly caused by a virus called VARICELLA ZOSTER VIRUS. It causes itching, blister like rashes, fever, headache, red spots on the body. The rashes appear first on chest, back and face, then spread over the entire body. It can be prevented through vaccine.



Vaccine includes 2 doses at different ages. Varivax is a vaccine. The first dose will be given at an age of 12 months and the second dose will be given at an age of 4 years. Treatment includes to relieve symptoms, if in case the infection is at higher risk antiviral medicine will be given.
